

School-Community Network 2020.21

September 15, 2020

- I. Stephanie Horak called the meeting to order and had members introduce themselves. Stephanie Horak was nominated for president and seconded. Dr. Shane Christensen volunteered to be the secretary.
- II. School Board President Liz Cox welcomed the group and gave a message of support for the teachers and staff.
- III. Dr. Carol Seid introduced Dr. Anthony Ferguson, WDMCS Executive Director of Equity, Inclusion, and Diversity. He discussed the six point plan and timeline he has set up for his “listening tour.” He is listening to what is going well and what are challenges. He will be developing training for all levels, conduct equity audits, look at the structure of School Resource Officers (SROs), and develop a Time Task Plan.
- IV. Dr. Lisa Remy, Superintendent, gave an overview of the beginning of the school year.
 - A. She praised staff, students, and parents for working together for a successful start. She thanked the SCN group for their support.
 - B. The Hybrid plan comes with challenges in using time differently and using technology differently.
 - C. Students have been wearing face coverings with no problems.
 - D. Added two Professional Development days for blended and online learning on 9/4 and 9/14
 - E. Mitigation strategies have been good and are being diligently followed. The hope is for the fewest number of people to be affected.
 - F. WDMCS has moved nine elementary sections to online learning for a short time
 - G. Crossroads Elementary was moved to online as a building for a short time. Waiting for waiver from the Department of Education if the building is to stay out longer than two days. We do not have the substitute teachers to cover the number of teachers who need to be gone.
 - H. Lunch on the first day was rough but has been good since then and getting better all the time.
 - I. A Dashboard has been added to share information on COVID numbers each week with stakeholders.

- J. Busing--The initial plan was to load from the back to the front and dismiss from the front to the back. To do contact tracing, we have moved to assigning seats so we know exactly who is sitting next to whom.
- K. Close contact is determined by being within six feet of a person testing positive for fifteen minutes or more.
- L. Dr. Remy asked Michelle Lettington, Associate Superintendent of Teaching and Learning, shared thoughts on the start of school.
- M. Dr. Lisa Remy shared comments from staff during the District Leadership Committee meeting.
- N. Questions were taken from the group
 - 1. Questions around contact tracing, when specific students would be quarantined versus when a full section would move to online learning, as well as, the process being used to determine who close contacts are during a 48 hours period both in school and out of school. The district works with Polk County Health during this process. The process to refute being in close contact was also shared. There is a section next to the Dashboard that shares the communication process.

 - 2. Cleaning and disinfecting processes and procedures were discussed
 - 3. Some questions were asked about specific schools
- O. Dr. Remy talked about Cares Act funds, distribution of the funds to private schools, and its use to purchase Chromebooks for lower grade levels and other technology tools to better support online learning. The WDM Foundation has been involved in helping with these endeavors as well as helping with supporting nutrition costs to feed students. Other funds have been used to hire the Heritage Group to disinfect schools, buses, etc. The district has spent more money than has been allocated and appreciates the Foundation's support to offset costs.
- P. Dr. Remy asked for celebrations and challenges from the group
 - 1. Incredibly grateful for districts efforts continuing the arts--drama, music, band, etc
 - 2. Virtual learning is going better than anticipated. Not without hiccups but has been great overall.
 - 3. Football--how can we make it safe for people to attend...people outside the fence are not being safe. All people on school property should have a face covering whether inside or outside the fence.

The district is looking at allowing some students into the game but keeping social distancing guidelines.

4. Canvas pages have been set up well and have helped online learners
 5. Gratitude for the culture and environment and positivity and calm from the top down to each building.
